Pen and Ink on Glass
Reversed Oil Painting
Amaryllis and Monarch Butterfly

Class Cost \$4

Size: Glass 11x14 inches

Other Supplies: Masking tape

1 quill pen

bottle of India ink

1 small plastic cup

paper towels

Palette knife

Small bottle of glass cleaner (must have ammonia)

Oil brushes - brights are the best - filberts - flats - old liner (old filbert brushes are okay, but the filbert brights are the ones i prefer). Sizes 2, 4, and 8

Inking must be done before class.

Place pattern under clean glass. Make sure your glass (side you will be inking) is clean, no finger prints. Place pattern under your glass. Place paper towel about 4 inches from top where you will begin inking. Keep paper towel under your hand, remember no oil or finger prints on inking side. Using Quill pen and India ink (start inking from top). Sometime the pen skips so be careful. Clean the pen as you go if it starts to collect too much ink.

Small plastic cup: place a small amount of ink in the cup. I hold the cup tilted a little, and with the pen pull the ink up one side of the plastic cup. This will allow you to see how much ink you have on the pen and also to see if it is working properly.

(cleaning the pen): pull the point between your finger, careful not to damage the point, with a paper towel sprayed with glass cleaner, clean the point of the quill pen. The inking may look wide, but will blend together when inking is complete. You need to complete this portion of the class at least 3 days before the seminar begins. I would like to have all of them completely dry.

Mistakes can be repaired by using a "Q"tip sprayed with glass cleaner. Gently squeeze a small amount of glass cleaner from the Qtip so it is not dripping wet. Clean your mistake carefully and let it dry before starting again.

The painting portion instructions will be given out at the start of class. If you have any questions concerning inking please call Jan. 352-563-6349

JUST A REMINDER:

NONE OF THE INKING CAN BE DONE THE DAY OF THE SEMINAR. IT MUST BE COMPLETELY DRY BEFORE STARTING TO PAINT.

Consider going to this fun gathering. You will enjoy getting to know many painters, sample delicious food and relax in beautiful wooded surroundings.

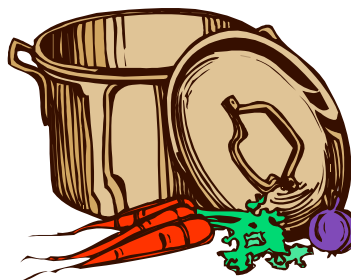

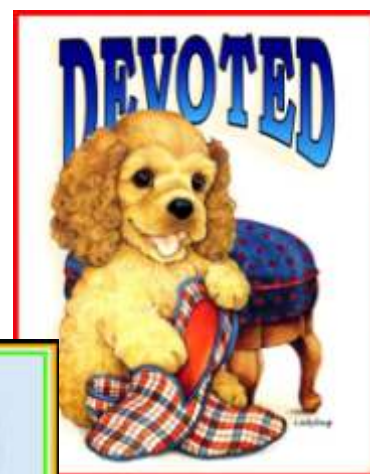
